Keeping Our **Community** Together



The Heart of Sustainable Farming Is **Community**








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Stronger Bonds, Stronger **Farms**








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
Building a Safe Space to **Share**

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
From Isolation to Inclusion

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Environmentally **Friendly** Ideas in Action






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Relationships Reduce Risk



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
Farming Is a **Shared** Responsibility



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
Generosity Drives **Growth**




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Building Momentum Together





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
Celebrating Community Successes

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Modeling for the **Next** Generation



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



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Everyone Has a Role
